						perhaps has a shot where her hand is not covering her mouth so that the viewer can
						see even more of her. The author could add a tad more contrast to the mono
						conversion for additional "pop" as it is a little greyscale as presented. As a junior
						worker, the author has a good eye for storytelling, keep it up.

						and because I am viewing the image on an iMac 27" screen, pay close attention to post
						processing brush work as is evident around the head and left arm as this has a negative
						impact on your image. One last improvement for the author to consider is the
						composition. The author has presented the image in an almost 1:1 ratio with a lot of
						negative space that adds no additional context to the scene. In addition, the "V-cut' of
						the abdominal muscles are right on the edge of the border and are quite distracting to
						me by virtue of the fact, and not just because I am a lady, that my eye is trying to "fill in
						the lines" further down. So either the author needs to crop a little higher to exclude
						them (a real pity) or be daring and intentional and crop a tad lower so that your
						composition is even stronger. The author could try a 4:5 ratio and see what they think?

The monochrome conversion is fair and suited to the subject matter. By means of improvement, the author could look at the composition of the image. The models eyes are looking to the left and over her shoulder, so that is where more space is required and not as presented on the right hand side. The bokeh on the top of the frame is very bright within the dark shadows of the foliage and pulls the viewers eye from the beautiful subject matter so rather tone it down or remove completely. A little dodge and burn in post processing to define the subjects face better would be advantageous.

The background wall/ fence structure is not straight and the pole close to the models face has a hard edge line which is very distracting. In addition, it has been darkened down too far to be natural when one looks at the bright light on the model. An image always needs to make sense to the viewers eye. Yes, darken backgrounds down but try keep it authentic. Whilst we do not take the title into consideration at salons, at club the author names images to give some context to the story they are trying to tell. In this case it is titled, "Day Dreaming" and yet the model had direct eye engagement with the author and looks a little annoyed? This may be by virtue of her eyes that are all the way into the corners? Had she been focussed ahead of her, to the left of the image the message would be stronger in my opinion.

To score even higher, I would have liked to see a little more of the gentlemans face on the right hand side and slightly more of the hat. Only by virtue of the title, "Homeless on the street" was I aware of the mans circumstances as he looks gentle and kind. Well done to the author for depicting this in your portrait. I spent considerable time looking at this image and appreciating the gentlemans smile, eyes and facial features. He is indeed a good candidate for monochrome portraiture as his dark skin and white hair are a good starting point combination. The author has a good, base image but there are a few post processing matters that could be addressed to elevate the image to a higher score. There is a lot of noise and this could be that a high ISO was used to capture the image. The eyes need more light for the viewer to engage best with this character and the overall contrast is too high. The author could consider removing the very white spot under the gentlemans nose as my eye goes there immediately. If the author has a few images of this gent, please revisit them and select an image where you are able to open up your composition a little. I can see that the gentleman has a piece of hair, or a curl in the centre of his forehead. This may be characteristic and it would be good to see more of the hair on the top of his head as well as the bottom of his beard. Please try these improvements and see if you find any of them beneficial

The model is a good fit for the clothing and I enjoy the way the square cut of her fringe is balanced by the high neck chocker jewellery and the high neckline of the dress itself. Perhaps I would have only had the one period piece chocker necklace as my eye does spend a little too much time on the other two necklaces instead of on her striking face but that is a personal choice. The criss-cross lacing of the dress is also an added element of interest and compliemnts the chocker necklace too so well done on a super styling effort! A few points for the author to consider going forward. Be very careful when using background select in post processing. The left edge of the models neck and the right cheek are very fuzzy and this is most unfortunate. The lighting is very even across the models face and there is little shadow detail which in turn renders the models features as flat and formless. She is leaning away from the photographer which looks uncomfortable and apprehensive. Could she have been seated in a position in the garden that wasnt quite as busy as the trees and lines in the background are very distracting and my eye goes to the brightest area, the white "patch" on the right hand side which is not what we want to focus on.

The fall of light appears to be natural across the top of her head, on the cheekbones and the right shoulder. This has been well handled and does add form to the woman. The repetition of the floral theme is strong and plays a good supportive role in the image. Additional dodge and burn across the flowers at the bottom and the subjects face would enhance this image as would selective lifting of the shadows on the hair so that the viewer sees a little more definition as it is blending into the background a little too much. A fine attempt, well done
4S	shankie	12	Gold	JOAN	JUNG	A strong and engaging portrait of this elegant lady where the lighting has been carefully considered and placed. The monochrome conversion is good and the composition sound. By means of improvement, the author would elevate the image by a little more refinement in post-processing. Using the spot heal or remove tool brushes, clean up the lint as seen on the right shoulder and down the jacket. The jacket is oversized for this lady and as such consider using the liquify filter to nudge in the jacket arm and bit more and remove some of the crinkles too as this will be more flattering to her form. To avoid enlarged pupils, one needs to have extra light in the setup. Sometimes a small table lamp will suffice but thisdepends entirely on the overall ambient light and what the author is wanting to achieve. In monochrome it is not as evident as it is in colour imagery. Finally, the author has elected to shoot the subject against a very black, tenebristic background which introduces a spotlight effect on the subject and also renders the clothing merging into the depth of the image. By means of improvement, a little separation between the background and the lady would be fortuitous and this is easily achieved in post processing if you were to add a layer beneath your subject and introduce a spot of light that you could use for edge definition on the left or right hand side. Just a suggestion - try it and see if you are in agreement?

The triangle form of the arms on a diagonal, always translates well as a visual element and brings a sense of dynamic into the picture. The lighting has been well-handled to emphasise the muscular toning and excellent physique of this gentleman. That the author has composed the image including a little of the mans jeans adds a good base/ anchor point to the scene. A little more light across the top of the head would have added detail to the hair which is lost against the black bacground but this can be lifted in post-processing. Whilst I believe the graininess and noise contributes to this image, unfortunately the image is not in focus. As a starting point, set your shutterspeed to be at least the reciprocal of your focal length of your lens for handheld images. Unless the author is exceptionally stable (and hasn't had copious cups of coffee ahead of the shoot) when shooting unsupported, the images will not be in sharp focus and this is a real pity. I hope there are other shots in this series where the images are more crisp as you have a fine eye. Keep it up!

The overall exposure is a little bright with evidence of a hotspot along the little girls white top and on the mothers bright eye. Reading the image it appears to be a one-light setup with the light coming in from the left hand side. This does render shadows across the parts of the Mom and Dads faces where the light gets trapped on the little babys face as she is positioned in front of her parents. African skin is also very reflective and introduces hot spots across the forehead and nose areas with ease. One needs to manage this on the day and in post processing edit afterwards too. A slight change of placement and a large, soft octabox would even out the lighting but even so, as presented I believe the author has presented an image that this family will treasure and that is what it is about

As it was shot on location with bright water as the background and little light on the ladies, the result is very even toned across the faces with clipped whites and black areas devoid of detail. The connection and eye engagement as well as their lovely smiles captures the moment and makes for a pleasing candid image

The author could consider adding a little more texture and clarity to the image. This isnt necessarily a bad thing but the result is that the face is flat and somewhat even toned and thus needs a little extra TLC in post processing to really define the mans features better. Try a little dodge and burn to bring more form into the mans face and pull down the exposure and highlights selectively on the clothing.

I can see that the light conditions were harsh and for the most part the author has made a good attempt to control the exposure across the mans facial features. Whilst the rope and parachute area is very bright, these elements add to the storytelling so the author can return the image to Lightroom or Camera raw and pull down the highlights and exposure a little more to keep the focus on the man. In addition adding a tad more contrast and doing a little more post processing could elevate the greyscale rendering to blacks with more impact
